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20-07 City of Colorado Springs Ballot Measure 2C Maintenance of Effort Spending (2019)

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Purpose

The purpose of this audit was to calculate the 2019 General Fund spending on repair and maintenance of roads and streets in order to determine if the 2019 spending met the Ballot 2C Maintenance of Effort (MOE) requirement.

Highlights

The 2019 annual spending for road and street repair and maintenance from the General Fund was \$3,663,762. The 2019 spending exceeded the Ballot 2C MOE requirement by \$965,249.

Maintenance of Effort (MOE): Ballot 2C specified the City of Colorado Springs maintain spending on repair and maintenance of roads and streets from the General Fund during the term of the temporary sales and use tax increase at an amount equivalent to the average spending from 2012 through 2014. The MOE was calculated by the City Auditor in the amount of \$2.699M. 2019 was the fourth year Ballot 2C revenue was collected and services were provided.
