



## Rescinded Burn Restriction Order

Due to current and forecasted conditions, Colorado Springs Fire Department, by and through its Division of the Fire Marshal, determines risks inherent to structure, grassland, and forest fires have reduced. Therefore:

**Effective Monday, March 1, 2021, at noon (MST),  
City of Colorado Springs rescinds December 16, 2020's  
Amended Burn Restriction Order.**

The following acts are **PROHIBITED AT ALL TIMES** within the City of Colorado Springs:

- Recreational fireworks / devices requiring ignition such as sparklers, snakes, aerials, comets, flares, flyers, fountains, missiles, mortars, spinners, punks, rockets, and shells
- Trash / rubbish burning

As of March 1, 2021, at noon (MST), the following acts shall be **ALLOWED** within the City of Colorado Springs:

- Bonfires – **permit required**
- Cooking devices and portable or fixed fireplaces\* intended for outdoor use, fueled by solid materials (wood, pellets, or charcoal) and/or liquid propane gas (LPG), natural gas, or liquid fuel
- Hot work activities such as welding, brazing, blasting, and torching – permit not required
- Model rockets – permit not required
- Pyrotechnic or commercial activities – **permit required**
- Code conforming recreational fires
