September 18th 4pm 2018 meeting Pikes Peak Room City Hall

Meeting was officially opened by Councilor Strand at 4.06pm
Councilor Strand suggested that communication specialist Skroback run the meeting.

Approval of the minutes from August 21st meeting was postponed till October meeting, as there was not a quorum.

As there were only 2 voting members in attendance, the meeting was somewhat brief.

Communication Specialist Skroback mentioned that Lisa Cross wanted to do a presentation on a proactive arts related event similar to Manitou, and has devoted many hrs to the proposal.

PAC Member brought up that Sean o'Mealie would give a presentation about his works downtown, specifically the collection of colored parrots at the October meeting

Councilor Stand wanted the commission to review the August minutes. The Michael Garmin Jr. sculpture was proposed for Bancroft Park was discussed as well as the best site for the work. A healthy discussion evolved. We all agreed that this would certainly be an asset to the city.

Pac member raised the issue of PAMP (Public Art Master Plan) and the need for the funding of the 14k to complete the 50K to enable the PAMP consultant to implement the plan process. A question was raised if City council could be approached for some help re funding, Councilor Strand mentioned that funding has been directed to public safety issues specifically the addition of extra police officers.

Councilor Strand mentioned that this could be brought to the attention of the COS CFO, and that he will raise the flag on the commission's behalf.

Another question was directed to Councilor Strand pertaining to the Funding of other Master plans, and these have been funded by the city.

Councilor Strand suggested that the Chair, Vice Chair and secretary come to an official Council meeting and that we representing the PAC present our case as to the rationale of matching the 14k needed to complete the 50K. the vehicle could be the Citizens Comment which is 3 mins duration.

This was certainly food for thought and maybe needs to be discussed at the next PAC meeting in October. PAC absenteeism was mentioned because the PAC does suffer from a lack of quorum, Councilor Strand mentioned that maybe those members can be contacted to see if they are still interested in attending the PAC meeting every month.

Communication specialist Skroback mentioned that there was a healthy crop of applicants for a seat on the PAC.
