Class Specification – Sales Tax Manager

Summary Statement:	
<p>The purpose of this position is to manage and oversee the collection of the City’s Sales and Use tax. This is accomplished by assigning, directing and reviewing work of staff, responding to inquiries from internal and external parties, preparing changes to codes and ordinances, preparing annual budget and monitoring expenditures. Other duties may include testifying in court hearings, resolving disputes, authorizing purchases, and serving on committees.</p>	
Essential Functions	Note: Regular and predictable attendance is an essential function in the performance of this job.
Time % (All below must add to 100%)	Note: Time spent on each essential function will vary based on operational needs and is only intended to be an approximation over the course of a full year.
45%	Manages staff by assigning and monitoring the work of staff members; providing direction; conducting meetings; completing performance reviews; and providing training.
30%	Provides taxpayer support by responding to inquiries; interpreting codes and policies; resolving conflicts; coordinating with other departments or agencies; reviewing contracts; issuing Sales Tax certificates; and providing data for annual audits.
25%	Prepares reports and conducts research by compiling monthly, quarterly, and annual data; reviewing proposed legislation and recent court decisions; developing or revising tax guides; providing updates to staff; and attending meetings.

Competencies Required:
<p>Human Collaboration Skills: Interactions have significant impact and may involve recommendations regarding potential policy development and implementation. Position evaluates customer satisfaction, develops cooperative associations, and utilizes resources to continuously improve customer satisfaction.</p>
<p>Reading: Advanced - Ability to read literature, books, reviews, scientific or technical journals, abstracts, financial reports, and/or legal documents. Ordinarily, such education is obtained at the</p>



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college level or above. However, it may be obtained from experience and self-study.

Math: Advanced - Ability to apply fundamental concepts of theories, work with advanced mathematical operations methods, and functions of real and complex variables. Ordinarily, such education is obtained at the college level or above. However, it may be obtained from experience and self-study.

Writing: Advanced - Ability to write editorials, journals, speeches, manuals, or critiques. Ordinarily, such education is obtained at the college level or above. However, it may be obtained from experience and self-study.

Technical Skills Required:

Advanced Skills and Knowledge: Work requires advanced skills and knowledge in approaches and systems, which affect the design and implementation of major programs and/or processes organization-wide. Independent judgment and decision-making abilities are necessary to apply technical skills effectively.

Relevant Background and Formal Education: Demonstrated skills, competencies, and knowledge required for this job are most often acquired through the following practical experience and level of academic education and training as suggested below.

Education: Bachelor’s degree from an accredited college or university with major coursework in accounting, business, finance or a related field.

Experience: Five years of full-time responsible tax collection, auditing, or accounting experience including one year of administrative or lead supervisory responsibility.

Education and Experience Equivalency:

One (1) year of the appropriate type and level of experience may be substituted for each required year of post-high school education.

Additional appropriate education may be substituted for the minimum experience requirements.

Certifications and Licenses: Must possess or be able to acquire the following certifications and/or licenses.



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Certifications required in accordance with standards established by departmental policy.	
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Supervision Exercised:
 Work requires supervising and monitoring performance for a regular group of employees or department including providing input or hiring/disciplinary actions and work objectives/effectiveness, performance evaluations, and realigning work as needed. A first line supervisor typically performs these functions.

Supervision Received:
 Receives Limited Direction: This job title normally performs the duty assignment according to his or her own judgment, requesting supervisory assistance only when necessary. Special projects are managed with little oversight and assignments may be reviewed upon completion. Performance reviewed periodically.

Fiscal Responsibility:
 This job title oversees budget preparation of a division or department budget. Reviews and approves expenditures of significant budgeted funds for the department or does research and prepares recommendations for organization-wide budget expenditures.

Physical Demands:
 Exerting up to 10 lbs. occasionally or negligible weights frequently; sitting most of the time.
