




Design and Development



- South of HWY 94
- 1,018 Acres Open Space
- Partnership with The Conservation Fund
- Purchase Price \$7,657,588
- Closed in May 2023









- Adjacent to Corral Bluffs and Jimmy Camp Creek Open Spaces
- Wildlife habitat: antelope, migratory birds, prairie dogs, reptiles
- Features: pond, views of Pikes Peak, grassland/prairie ecosystem
- Cultural/historical significance; geologic features
- Saved from imminent residential development (Surrounding area is zoned for residential/mixed use development by El Paso County and is owned by private development firms.)























































- GOCO Land Acquisition Grant Program
- Initial meeting w/GOCO Program Officer on 2/16/23.
- Follow-up discussions with GOCO Program Officer in April-June 2023.
- Concept paper submitted on 7/20/23.
- Concept paper approved on 8/9/23. Invited to submit full proposal.
- Site tour with GOCO representatives on 8/11/23.
- Full proposal due 9/7/23.
- Request amount \$1.5 Million
- Award decisions will be announced on 12/8/23.
- If selected, the award will be disbursed in Q1 2024 and applied back to the TOPS fund.





















Red Rock Canyon Open Space Trail System – Palmer Trail Area








Existing Trail Closure

Red Rock Canyon Open Space Trail System – Palmer Trail Area










Palmer Trail Soil Loss Estimates

One Storm Erosion (July 2023) 16 CY


















