  - Acquired in 2014
  - Trail alignment to be determined
  - Floodplain and terrain constraints
  - Development with timing of Railroad/Las Vegas St. construction








- Bridge over Railroad



## PIKES PEAK RURAL TRANSPORTATION AUTHORITY (PPRTA)





- Originally approved by voters in 2004 for maintenance, transit operations, and capital improvements, funded by sales tax
- Projects prioritized into A and B list
- Projects presented to PPRTA Citizen's Advisory Committee (CAC) and Board for review
- Projects include: transportation network gaps, signal upgrades, corridor improvements, sidewalk, transit enhancements, and trail construction

- Cottonwood Creek Trail: Academy Underpass

- **Templeton Gap Trail:** Asphalt Replacement between Hancock and Union Blvd.



# **PRESENCE ON TRAILS**



- UTRT operates 7 days a week, with two Rangers on Saturday and two on Sunday
- UTRT conducts vehicle and bicycle patrols along our City's urban trails
  - Rangers have covered over 300 miles of trails, open spaces and parks on bicycles
- UTRT provides presence at our high trafficked parks and open spaces
- UTRT make public contacts, manage trail hazards, complete trail maintenance and remove trash






# MAPPING ILLEGAL CAMPS AND TRASH LOCATIONS




- UTRT utilizes ArcGIS to identify and map the locations of illegal camps along our urban trails and within parkland
- Approximately 1400 illegal camps have been identified since July 2023
  - Currently there are approximately 260 active/uncleaned up camps
- Approximately 400 homeless associated trash locations have been identified since July 2023
  - Currently over 170 have been cleaned up.

COLORADO SPRINGS

- UTRT collaborates with various City entities such as CSPD Homeless Outreach Team, CSFD Homeless Outreach Program, and Neighborhood Services – Quality of Life Team
- UTRT partners with Keep Colorado Springs Beautiful to assist with camp clean ups
- Attend monthly meetings with numerous government and nonprofit organizations who specialize in homelessness related issues
